All of my experiences with the YMCA were positive growing up and little did I know that the Jackie Robinson would become an important part of my life. In May 2015 I became a front desk staff and had no idea what to expect. I started learning more about what we had to offer and it was definitely eye opening. Children were attending summer camps, swimming lessons, and learning new life skills. On top of that they were exposed to our wonderful staff who serve as positive role models. In the past year I've received calls from victims of abuse and families experiencing hardship. The community views us as a safe haven and we have to find ways to help. Overall, the YMCA has made me a healthier, more compassionate human being. I love what I do and am lucky to serve the community I grew up in.</p>	<p>One of the great benefits of a new facility is that we can serve more people. Southeast San Diego has a mix of ethnicity, religion and backgrounds. The impact of the new Y will vary in each household. In my opinion, the most important changes we will see in the first year will be economic, community and health related. In order to run efficiently, we will need more staff and job opportunities will be available to the community. Secondly, our programs will help change the community. With more children joining extracurricular activities or volunteering, they'll be off the streets and developing life skills. Lastly, the health of the community will improve greatly. The Y provides a place for parents, teens, children and seniors to get their daily dose of exercise. Members can also receive nutritional education that will help them reach their goals.</p>
